## Camp Management and Camp Coordination (CCCM) Cluster Co-Facilitator

As lead agency for migration and migration-related challenges, IOM's first and foremost responsibility is to ensure the safe and dignified provision of assistance to migrants caught in crisis. Following the deterioration of the security situation in Bangui, Central African Republic after December 5th, 2013 and the massive displacement that resulted from it, IOM has supported the humanitarian response effort for displaced people in the following ways.



As global co-lead of the CCCM Cluster, IOM was appointed co-lead of the CCCM Cluster CAR in January 2014. In this capacity, IOM is providing:

- Strategic direction of CCCM activities and priorities to humanitarian actors;
- Information management services, informing the Cluster and its members of displacement trends, and liaising among humanitarian actors on the population's multi-sector needs, humanitarian response and voluntary return intentions;
- Coordination and direct humanitarian assistance and protection of affected populations;
- Facilitation of voluntary returns through effective information dissemination and strategy definition in close collaboration with other humanitarian actors to ensure that peace and reconciliation, livelihood, shelter and other required social infrastructure measures are in place.

## Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM)

IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) program collects and disseminates information on displacement to the humanitarian community. As part of the DTM program, site facilitators visit IDP sites, collect information on population movements and displacement figures, and share reports with the Cluster on a weekly basis. DTM is an important information management tool and resource for humanitarian actors, who can access the following information products:

- Weekly Site Needs Reports shared with all Clusters to solicit multi-sector interventions. This report
  presents information collected in the field on the numbers of IDPs per site and the needs per sector
  (protection, WASH, health, food security, shelter and security);
- Monthly Site Profiles describing the characteristics of each IDP site to facilitate the delivery of
  pertinent humanitarian assistance to specific areas;
- Monthly Return Intention Surveys assessing IDPs' intentions to return and perceived challenges, which inform planning and assistance;
- **Monthly DTM reports** illustrating the trends in displacement, the priorities in the needs expressed by IDPs and the number of humanitarian assistance interventions per sector.
